Exodus 3:11-13 “ _____ Moses said to God, “_____ that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?” 12 So He said, “I will certainly be with you. And this shall be a sign to you that I have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain.” 13 Then Moses said to God, “Indeed, when I come to the children of Israel and say to them, ‘The God of your fathers has sent me to you,’ and they say to me, ‘What is His name?’ _____?”

Exodus 4:1 “Then Moses answered and said, “_____ suppose they will not _____ me or _____ to my voice; suppose they say, ‘The Lord has not appeared to you.’”

Exodus 4:10-13 “ Then Moses said to the Lord, “O my Lord, _____, neither before nor since You have spoken to Your servant; but I am slow of speech and slow of tongue.” So the Lord said to him, “Who has made man’s mouth? Or who makes the mute, the deaf, the seeing, or the blind? Have not I, the Lord? 12 Now therefore, go, and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you shall say.” 13 _____ he said, “O my Lord, please send by the hand of whomever _____ You may send.”
